FOOD PANTRY NEWS

PLEASE HELP US TAKE CARE OF THOSE IN NEED

For many of us hunger is just a short moment of discomfort, while for others it is an extensive state of distress. But with your help, we can make a difference! The Wheeling Township Food Pantry provides non-perishable food, toiletries, and household items to the needy residents of our communities, all year round. Presently our food pantry provides food to about 200 people every month, and the number of people requesting food continues to increase. As donations decrease in the summer months, the pantry runs short of supplies. Therefore, we would appreciate any donations, small or large, during these crucial months. In particular, the following items are always in great demand:

- bottled juice
- cereal
- coffee – small
- sugar (small size)
- beef stew
- dried beans
- powdered milk
- honey
- jams & jellies
- canned meat
- rice
- cooking oil
- tomato products
- spaghetti sauce
- napkins
- paper towels
- shampoo/conditioner
- toothbrushes and toothpaste
- diapers– size 4 -5 and 6
- toilet paper (4-pack/ single roll)
- detergent and cleaning supplies



We also accept food gift certificates in denominations of \$10 or \$20 from local food stores.

Please check expiration dates on items as **no expired food is allowed in the food pantry**. Donations can be dropped off at the Township office Monday through Friday between 9 am and 4:30 pm. Thanks for your support!

Appeals of 2006 assessments at the Cook County Assessor's office and the Cook County Board of Review for Wheeling Township have concluded. The 2006 assessment appeal process is now closed. Your second half 2006 tax bill will be computed based on your current assessment and that bill will arrive in late summer or early fall of this year.

The triennial reassessment for north suburban Cook County is taking place right now. Wheeling

Township property owners can expect to receive their reassessment notices in late September. Property owners will have 30 days from the date of the assessment notice to file an appeal with the Cook County Assessor's office.

Unlike past years the Cook County Assessor is not including an appeal form with the reassessment notice. If you believe you have been unfairly assessed or if there is an error in your property description, you can get an appeal form at the Cook County Assessor's web site at www.cookcountyassessor.com.

You can also stop by our office at 1616 N. Arlington Heights Road (2nd Floor). Our staff is available to assist you in researching evidence to support your appeal and/or to assist you in filling out the form. If you choose not to appeal at the County Assessor's office, you will have an opportunity to appeal at a later date with the Cook County Board of Review.

Keep in mind that an increase in your assessment does not necessarily mean that there will be a corresponding increase in your tax bill. Also please note that 2007 reassessments will be reflected on the second installment tax bills received in 2008.

UPDATES ON 2007 PROJECTS...

A new project for the *Dunlo Subdivision* has been awarded to LoVerde Construction Co., scheduled to begin sometime during the middle of June. Residents will be notified of the exact start date. This project will complete drainage ditch improvements throughout this subdivision, with work being done on Betty Dr., Ellen Dr., Dunlo Ave. and Old Buffalo Grove Rd. Once completed, our

plan is to have all the roads within this area re-paved next spring.

The other major project scheduled for this year is to complete the drainage ditch restorations along both sides of **Woodland Ave.** in preparation for re-paving it. This work is still in the planning stage and will be put out for bid later this summer.

Controlling Stormwater Pollution...

Always remember that stormwater runoff does **not** go to a wastewater treatment plant. Instead, it flows directly into area tributaries that flow into the Des Plaines River. Such untreated runoff can carry soil, nutrients and other pollutants into the river, causing excessive growth of weeds and algae, and can clog the tributaries, which impedes stormwater drainage away from homes within your village or subdivision.

There are many ways you can reduce polluted stormwater runoff:

- Keep trash, leaves and grass clippings off streets and out of road drainage ditches
- Collect and compost yard waste, or leave grass clippings on the lawn
- Select the tallest acceptable mowing height
- Minimize the use of pesticides, fertilizers and de-icing materials
- Test your soil and use zero phosphate fertilizer if possible
- Properly dispose of hazardous wastes
- Don't pour oil, pesticides, paint or other material down stormwater manholes or into road drainage ditches
- Pick up and bury or flush pet wastes
- Keep cars tuned up and repair leaks
- Wash your car on the lawn or use a commercial car wash

SPOTLIGHT ON...

CEDA CHILDCARE – assists families while employed or in full-time educational programs with childcare. They also provide case management and life skills training and emergency assistance to prevent loss of employment.

CEDA HEADSTART – provides a developmental and learning curriculum for children ages 3-5 who are from low income and/or disadvantaged families.

CHILDREN'S ADVOCACY CENTER – facilitates the identification, intervention and prevention of child abuse and acts as advocate for child in court system.

GREATER WHEELING YOUTH OUTREACH – empowers young people from lower income families with opportunities, skills and vision to achieve long-term educational goals.

THE HARBOUR – provides emergency shelter and transitional living services for youth in crisis, girls ages 12-21, and independent living services to male and female ages 17-21. 24 hour crisis hot line.

MIDWEST COUNCIL FOR CHILDREN WITH DISABILITIES – serves children with physical, developmental and cognitive disabilities by providing the financial means to pursue medical treatments and therapies.

OMNI YOUTH SERVICES – provides comprehensive services to adolescents and their families. through programs of counseling, prevention and partnerships.

SHELTER – is a 24 hour emergency and temporary housing agency for children and adolescents who have been abused, neglected, dependent, or in need of supervision. The Healthy Families program educates at-risk families on nutrition, personal care and parenting skills.

CATHOLIC CHARITIES/SENIOR SERVICES – provides supportive services to seniors citizens enabling independence in a safe and functional manner for as long as possible.

COMMUNITY COMPANION VOLUNTEERS – uses trained volunteers to provide free in-home respite to people caring for older relatives in their homes.

MEALS ON WHEELS -

Deliver meals to the homebound – once a month, twice a month or on an as-needed basis. Monday through Friday (you pick your day) 11:00 – 12:30pm

FRIENDLY VISITOR –

You are matched with a senior living in your immediate area to visit and/or pick up medicines and groceries - once a week or two times per month for approximately 1-1/2 hours.

CARING CALLER –

Simply requires a phone call made by you to another homebound person. Call weekly or two or three times monthly.

A-OK (ACTS OF KINDNESS) –

Men or woman who possess basic home maintenance skills become Team Advisors for high school students to supervise fall and spring clean up yard projects as well as other simple home maintenance work. Time commitment is usually 6-7 hours in the month of November and 6-7 hours either during the end of April or May.

HEALTH SCREENINGS AT THE TOWNSHIP

The following health screening services are administered through the Township nurse, Marilyn Helms, for residents 60 years of age and over.

FREE BLOOD PRESSURE SCREENINGS - WALK-IN BASIS

Over half of adults over 60 have hypertension (high blood pressure), which increases the risk for developing cardiovascular disease, stroke, kidney disease and congestive heart failure. Prevention, diagnosis, and treatment provide proven benefits. The Township nurse will be available at the township for WALK-IN Blood Pressure Screenings from 10:30 am until 12 noon on:

The nurse will visit the homebound to assess needs, and monitor blood pressure, blood sugars, and Pro Time. If you are homebound and in need of the above services, call to schedule an appointment.

ANTICOAGULATION THERAPY TESTING (PRO TIME)

Tuesdays and Thursdays, 9:00 am - 3:30 pm, by appointment. \$6 charge

THE FOLLOWING HEALTH SERVICES ARE AVAILABLE TO RESIDENTS 18 YEARS OF AGE AND OLDER:

MANTOUX TEST FOR TB

Every Tues. morning, by appointment. Test is read in 48 hours. \$1 charge.

CHOLESTEROL SCREENING

An 8 hour *fasting (water only)* lipid profile including total cholesterol, HDL, LDL, triglycerides, and blood sugar - \$15 charge. Non fasting total cholesterol and HDL - \$10 charge. Requires drawing of a blood sample from a fingertip. 4th Thursday of each month – 9:30 am – 1:00 pm, by appointment.

HEMOCULT KITS (for cancer screening of blood in the stool)

Kits available any time during Township office hours. Tests are done at home and returned by mail to the nurse for reading. \$4 per kit.

LIFELINE KITS

This kit includes a personal medical history sheet, which you fill out and then place on your refrigerator door in the distinctive red vinyl Lifeline envelope. In case you are unconscious or unable to speak, paramedics will have ready access to vital medical information. Stop by the Township to pick up your packet.

RTA REDUCED FARE CARDS

Applications for seniors 65 years of age and over are available through the Township for reduced rides on buses and trains. Come into the Township to complete your application. \$2.00 picture fee.

PERMANENT AND TEMPORARY PARK PLACARD APPLICATIONS

You may pick up forms to take to your doctor to apply for a permanent or temporary placard. Wheeling Township can issue the temporary cards for a three month period. Permanent placard applications (4 years) must be mailed to Springfield, Illinois.

IMPORTANT FLU SHOT INFORMATION

VEHICLE STICKERS FOR UNINCORPORATED WHEELING TOWNSHIP - DON'T GET A TICKET FOR NO VEHICLE STICKER!

As a convenience to our unincorporated Wheeling Township residents, the Clerk's Office is now selling 2007-08 vehicle stickers. The Cook County Vehicle sticker classes and costs are: smaller passenger vehicles under 4,500 pounds - \$40; larger passenger vehicles over 4,500 pounds - \$50.00; vehicles registered to a person 65 years

of age or older - \$5. The deadline to display your sticker is **July 1st**. Applications are also available at the Township for those of you who did not receive one in the mail.

An added bonus for seniors – Once you purchase your senior sticker it is valid the entire time you own that car! Every resident, with identification proving you are 65 or older, is eligible.

Are you registered to vote? If not, this is the time to do so. This is also the time for any adult who has just turned 18 to register. Have you just moved into the Township, have moved to another residence, or changed your name? If so, come to the Clerk's Office, Monday – Friday, between

9:00-4:30 to register. All you need are two forms of identification, one showing your current address. Once you have registered, there is no need to re-register unless you move or change your name again.

"Wheeling Township Historical Tidbit" On Friday, June 4, 1852, the first survey was taken of Wheeling Township which laid out the land into four definitive quarters. Nine months later, on Saturday, March 5, 1853, the Township board met at the home of Joseph Filkins to appoint a new Supervisor to fill the vacancy for the balance of the term. This action was taken because Supervisor John Filkins moved out of the County. By unanimous decision, Joseph Filkins was named Supervisor.
